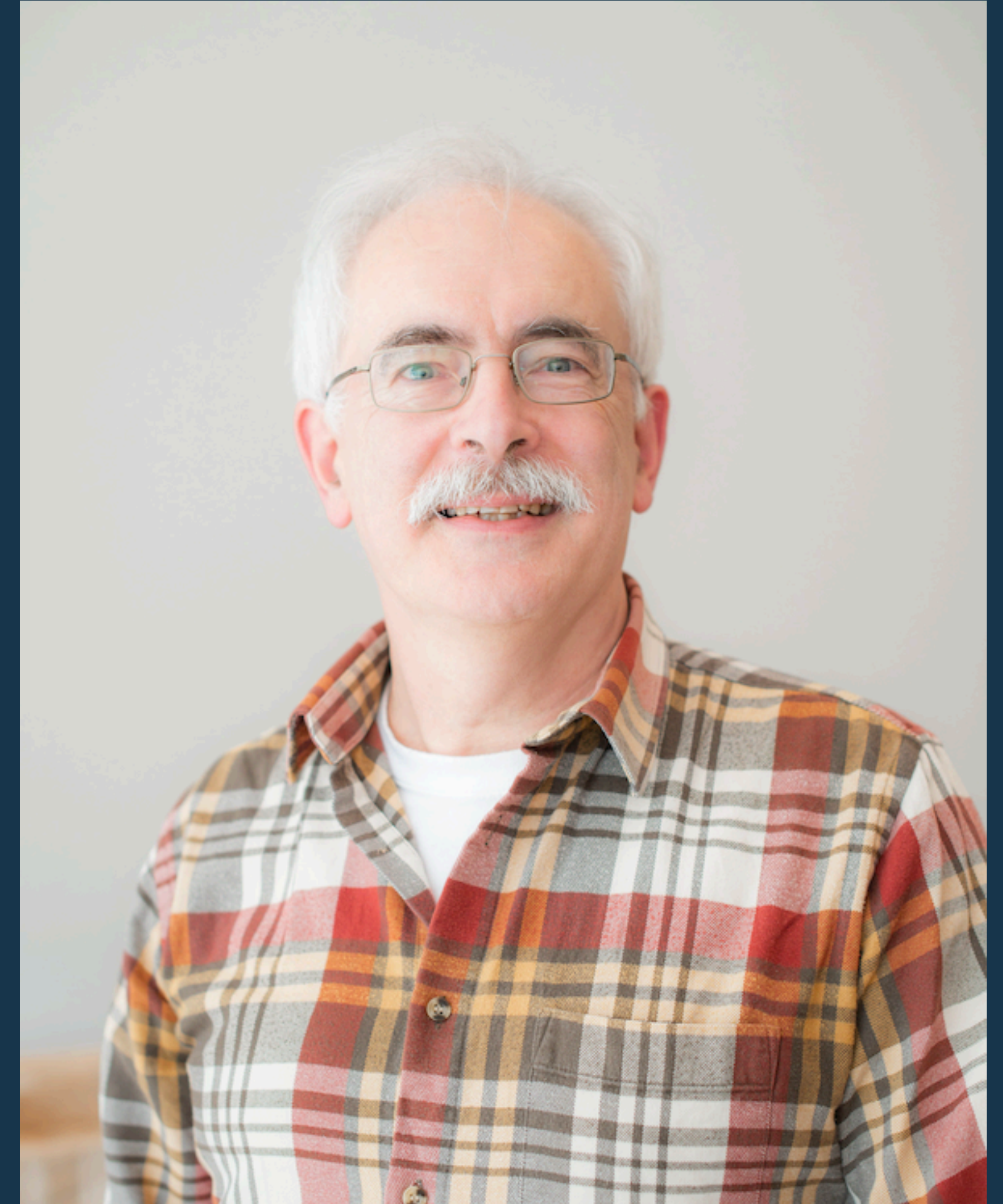

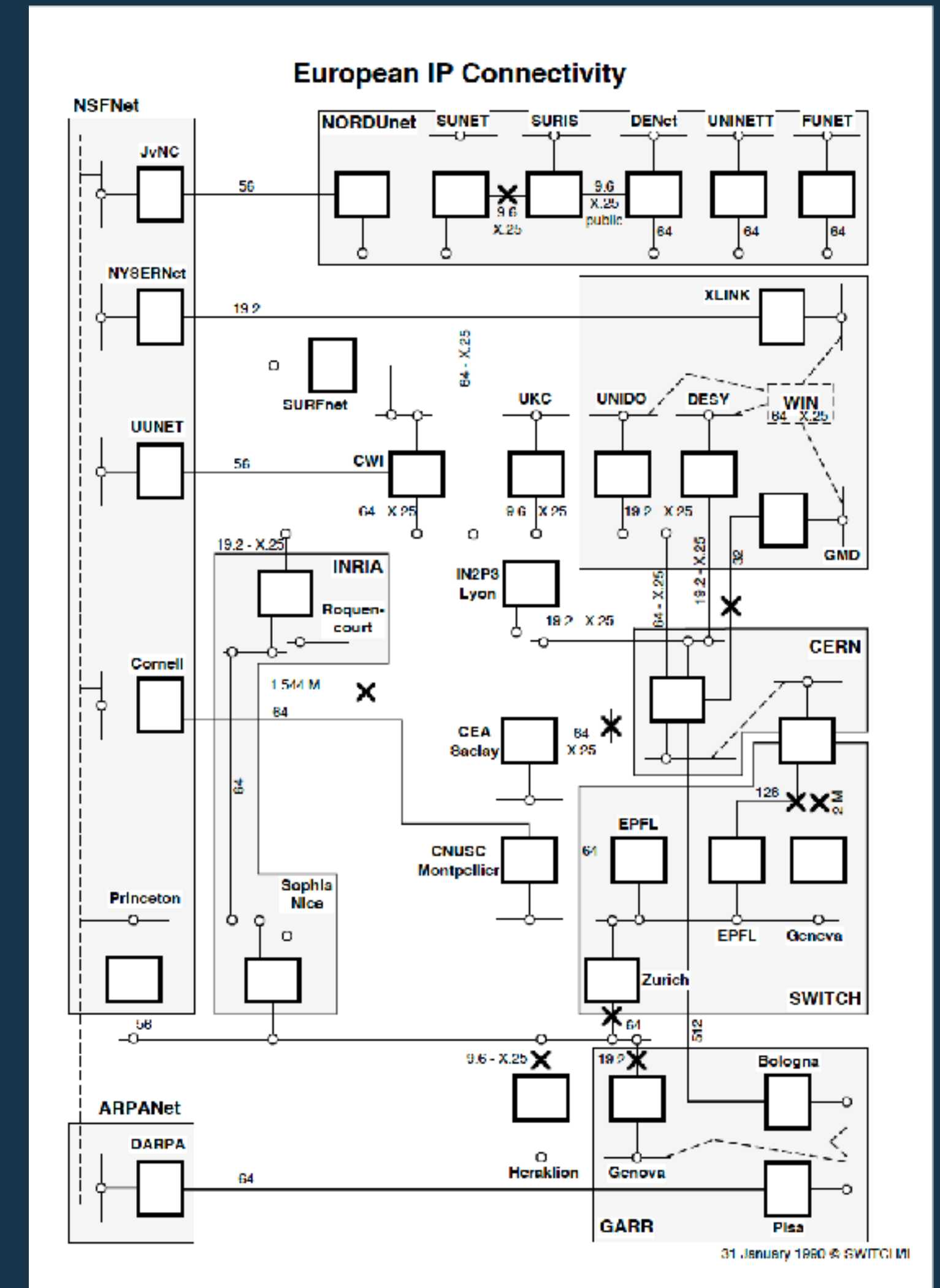

The Registry

/RIPE-NCC



- Maintains the RIPE Database
- Allocates and manages Internet number resources via the LIR Portal
- Investigates hijacks and policy violations
- Supports and facilitates the Policy Development Process with the community
- Ensures secure routing with RPKI

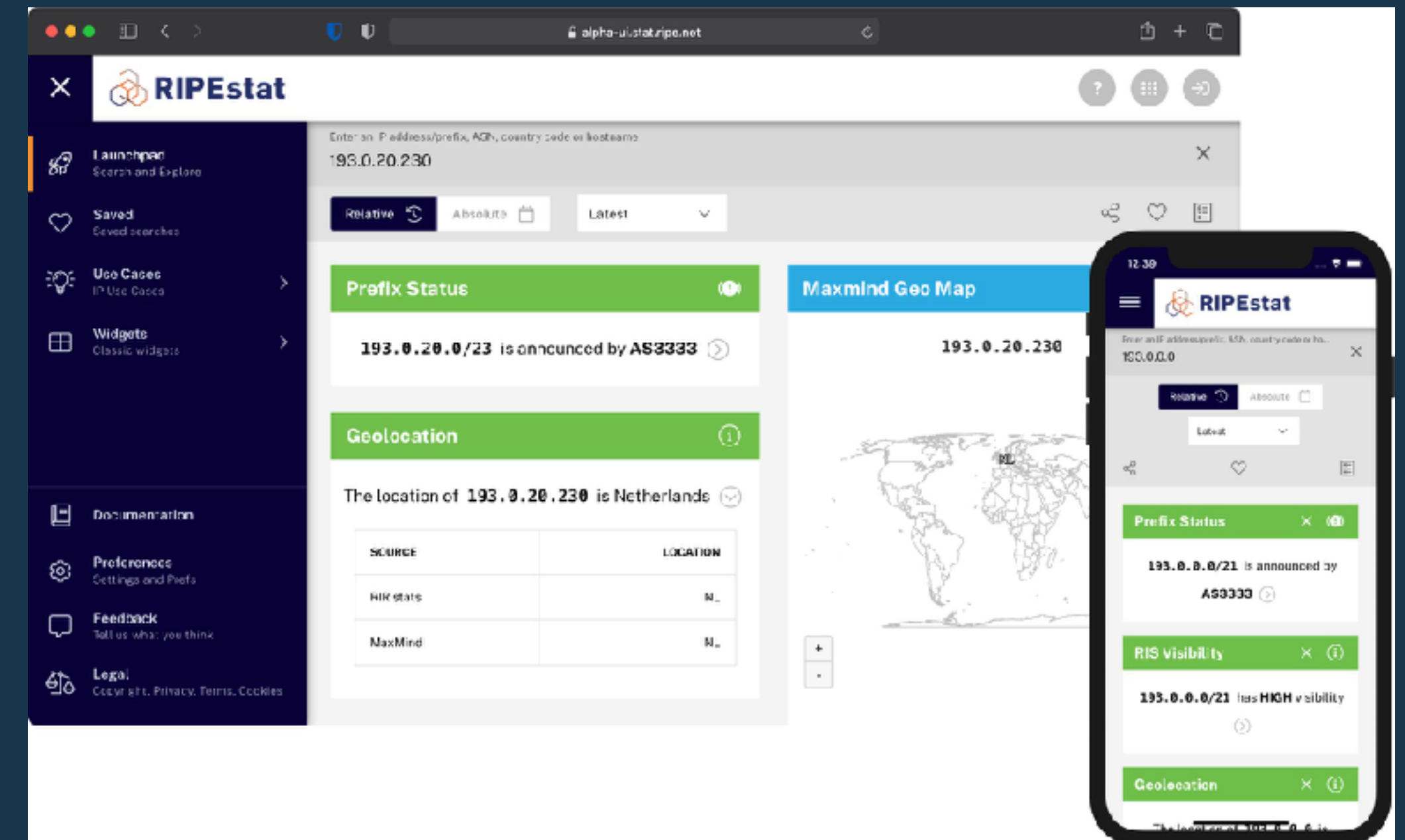


Information Services

/RIPE-NCC



- Develops and maintains Internet measurement services (RIPEstat, RIPE Atlas, RIS, RIPE IPmap)
- Operates K-root, one of the 13 root-name servers
- Delegates reverse DNS zones for the address ranges we manage and provides reliable, authoritative name servers

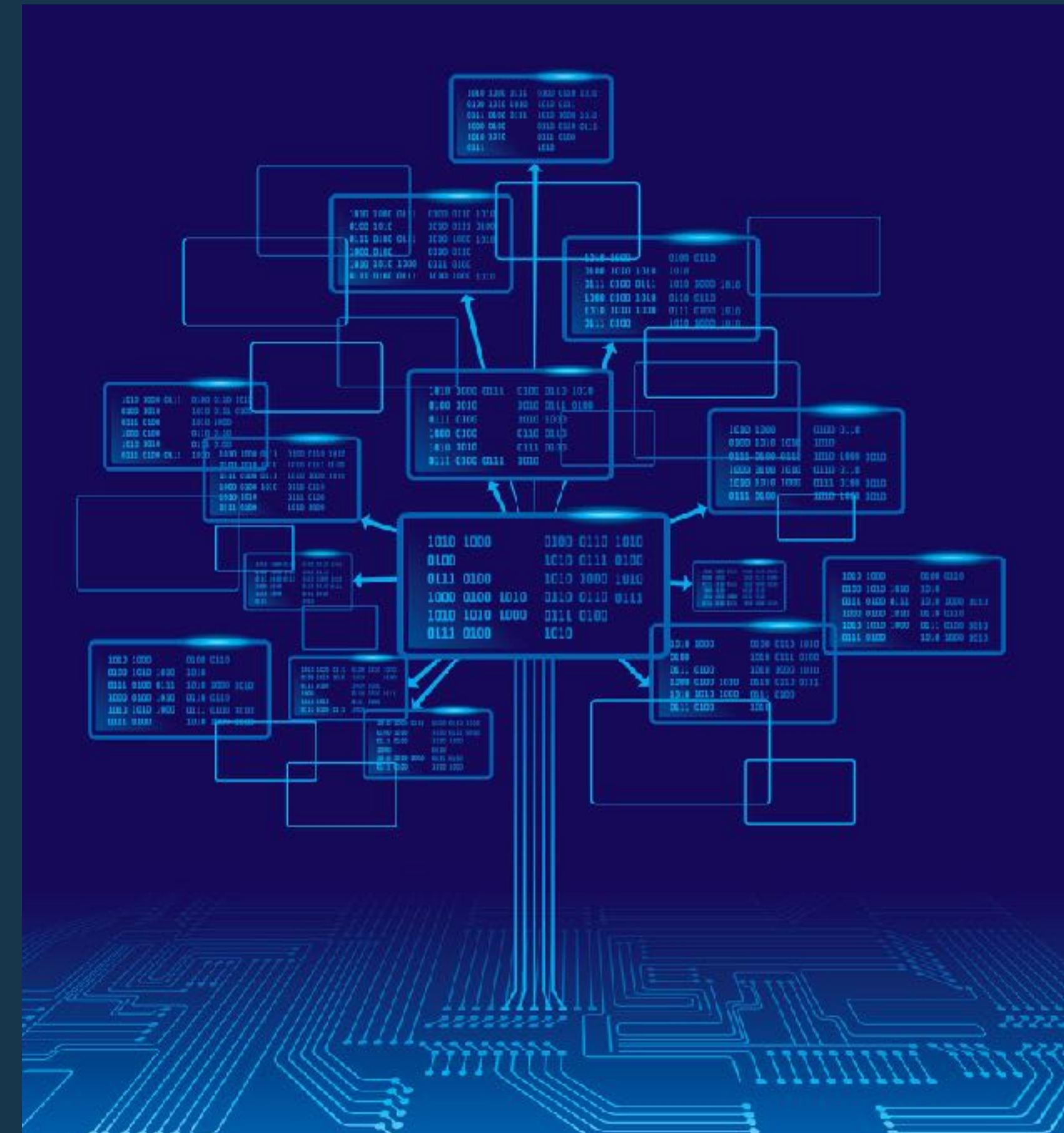


The RIPE Database

/RIPE-NCC



- Provides accurate registration information of Internet number resources
- Publishes routing policies by network operators (RIPE IRR)
- Facilitates coordination between network operators
- Provisions Reverse Domain Name System (rDNS) and ENUM delegations
- Enables research into network operations and topology



The LIR Portal

- Lets you manage your registry data and make queries and updates.
- Make requests for IPv4, IPv6 and AS Numbers
- Open tickets with Member Services
- View billing and membership information
- Secure your routing with RPKI

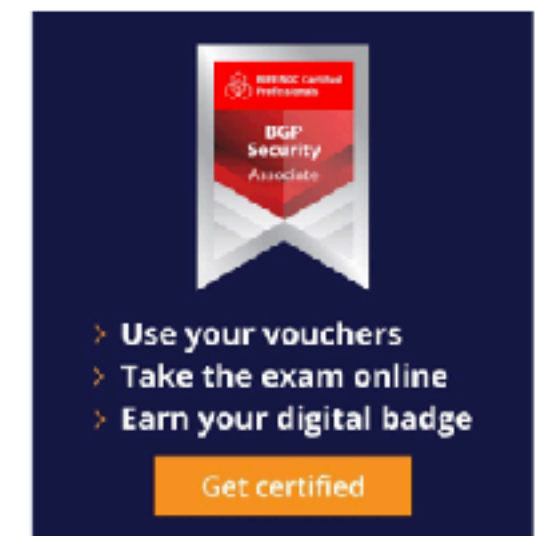
The LIR Portal lets you manage your registry data and make queries and updates.

Features of the LIR Portal include:

- View and edit your LIR contact and address information
- View billing information
- View IP and AS resources
- Check the status of open tickets
- Register for the RIPE NCC General Meeting
- Request IPv4, IPv6 and AS Numbers
- Update certain attribute values in allocation objects
- Request approval and have an assignment automatically registered in the RIPE Database

All information exchanged is encrypted to ensure security.

The [RIPE NCC Member Update](#) is a useful way to stay up-to-date with the latest RIPE and RIPE NCC developments, issues and policies.

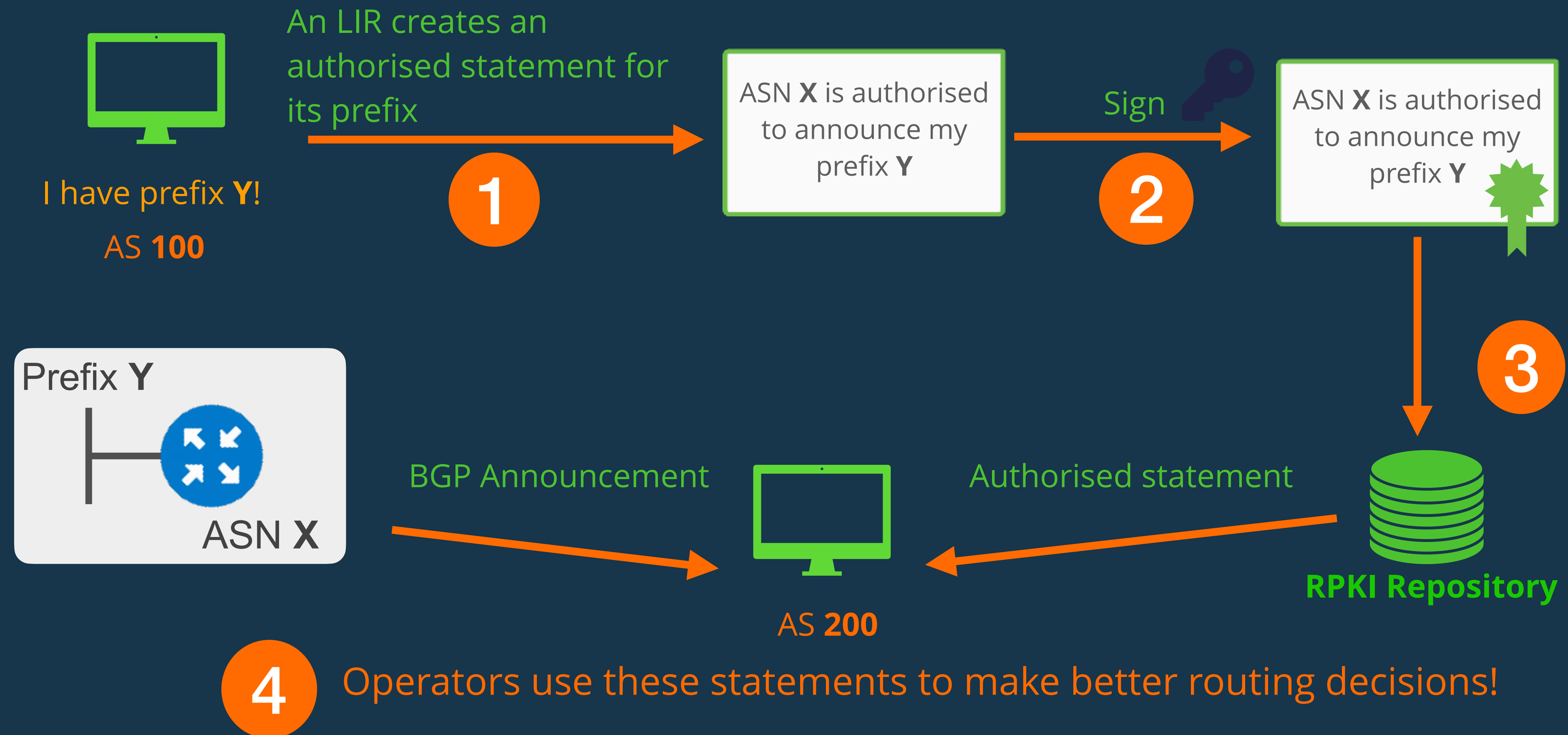

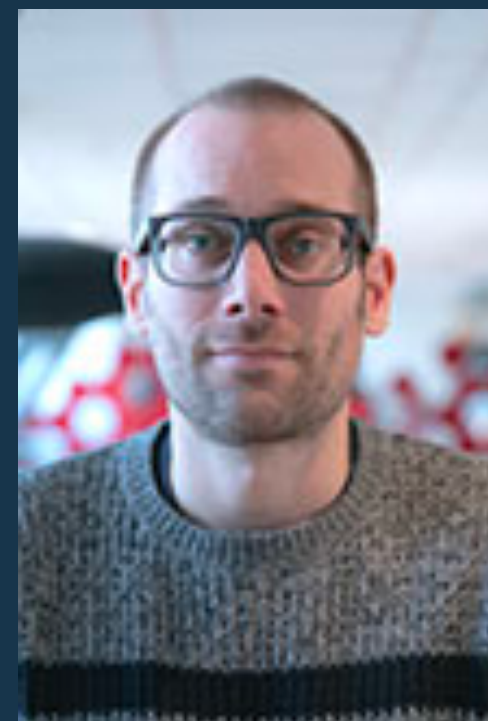

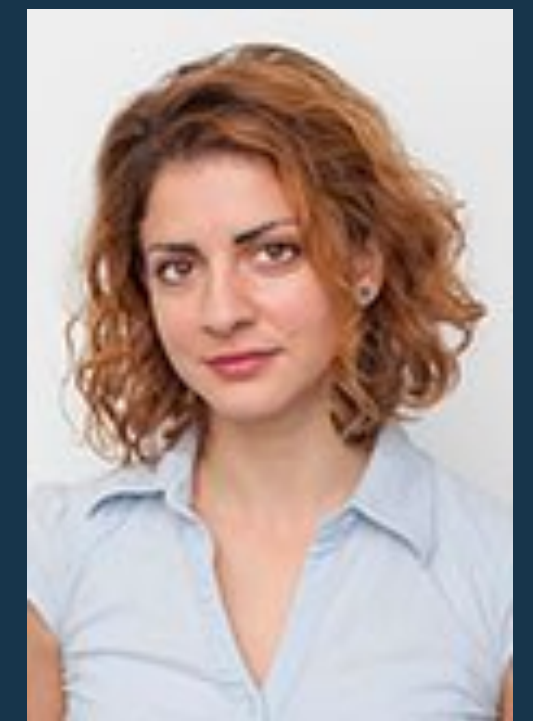
