

Navigating Diverse Governance Cultures Across the RIPE NCC Service Region




- The RIPE NCC operates in a diverse region that spans over 75 countries and has different political, regulatory, and cultural contexts.



 - Driven policy positioning on Internet governance and public policy.

 - National and regional initiatives (i.e Leb IGF, Arab IGF, SAMENA, and League of Arab States)
